Remington Homeowners

Every three years Maryland homeowners receive property value assessments on which



state, county and municipal property taxes are based. Until this year, homeowners were automatically entitled to the tax credit. But now a new law

enacted by the Maryland General Assembly requires all homeowners to make a one time application in order to be eligible to receive or continue receiving, the Homestead Tax Credit. The applications for the credit were mailed out with all new tax assessments. Please use the postage paid envelope and they must be back in by April 1, 2008. Do not delay on this matter.

Trash should be placed out no earlier than 6:00 a.m. the day of trash pickup. **You must use a trash can.** You are not allowed to leave your trash can in front of your home. **Fine \$50.**

Bottles and cans and Paper will be collected in Remington every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month. Use the new city distributed Yellow Recycle bins or the old blue ones. Place all recyclables in the bin. Instead of separating your bottles, cans, jars and paper, you can now place all these items in one container for collection.
