Mapping out Remington

Maps on Purpose started its Remington workshops Wednesday October 17th at the Greenmount School. This group of community residents, neighborhood kids and Greenmount students will be meeting every Wed for a total of eight sessions.

The theme of the workshop is "Where we walk and why?" Each participant will be mapping the paths we choose to take and the paths that we choose to avoid in our neighborhood. They will also be exploring the reasons behind these choices.

Issues including safety, beautification, lighting, and sanitation will be addressed. Participants in the workshop will be creating their own individual walking maps as well as adding their individual routes to a large joint neighborhood map.

All maps will be exhibited in Remington in early December and some of the maps created will go on exhibit at the Walters Art Museum as a part of an historical maps exhibit in the Spring.

Art on Purpose is presenting the project and encourages all interested residents to contribute to the project by mapping their own paths that they take in the neighborhood and noting their experiences from their walks.

On November 15th there will be a Free Health Fair at St Mary's Outreach Center, 3900 Roland Ave, Hampden MD.


Come for a day of FREE health screenings, Flu/pneumonia shots, insurance information, blood pressure screenings, diabetes testing and information, home health care info and much more.

..Caleb and the Colors of Music

Remington is becoming a growing place for artists of various venues to hang out. Musician Caleb Stine, a young man with a warm voice, is one of those artists. When interviewed Caleb revealed the musician that is inside the man. His songs are a music with a depth and soul and thus, without seeming to, often have a story woven through them.

BC: What would you say is your favorite piece that you have written?



CS: My best songs usually come quickly and tend to be written from experience. People want to hear something that they know is true, and human beings have highly tuned B.S. sensors. As a songwriter it's often easy to get caught up in what you think people want to hear, but then you write songs about someone else's experiences, or things you've seen on TV, and that stuff always rings false. Some of my favorite songs are ones written about traveling around America

BC: Was there an individual or experience that influenced your decision to study music? Who was it or what happened?

CS: I always felt Music very deeply, like an emotion in itself, and I was drawn into studying it naturally, like a painter who learns about different brushes because she knows it will help her ideas onto the canvas.

BC: You came to Baltimore from out west, has the East coast and Baltimore been inspiring? What brought you to Baltimore?

CS: I love Baltimore. I first came here on a road-trip after college when I spent 3 months driving around the country, working a bit and staying with friends and family. Baltimore struck me as so alive, sort of how I imagine parts of Europe to be, you know, the markets and restaurants and people talking across their porches. And I met so many genuine and artistically motivated people here. Baltimore is an authentic city and it doesn't put up with pretense or pride, which is good for a musician, because those are the two quickest ways to kill Art.

BC: Will there be a new album soon?

CS: We're working on the new record right now. It's going to feature a lot of the songs I've played live with the band and also some new, more quiet, solo acoustic stuff. It'll also include the song 'Come Back Home' that WTMD has been playing.

City Trash Laws

Trash should be placed out no earlier than 6:00 a.m. the day of trash pickup. You must use a trash can. You are not allowed to leave your trash can in front of your home. Fine \$50.

Bottles and cans will be collected Citywide every 2nd and 4th Monday of each month in blue plastic bags. (Glass jars, bottles, plastic containers, empty aerosol cans)

Paper will be collected every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month. (White/colored paper, cardboard, newspaper, magazines, books, catalogs. Tie in bundles or place in paper bags or cardboard boxes.)
