LOWE'S and more Coming to Remington

It was reported earlier this month in the Baltimore Sun that Baltimore's first Lowe's home improvement store, a supermarket and several other specialty shops and an apartment complex would be coming to the border of Remington and Charles Village. The shopping center would be on the properties that are now Anderson Automotive and stretches along on 11 acres roughly bounded by 25th St. to the north, Maryland Avenue to the east, 24th St. to the south and the CSX rail line to the west.

Rick Walker, chief executive of Walker Developments Inc., said he has strong interest from Lowe's and interest from lenders to finance the project, which he said would begin construction in Fall 2010 and open in 2011.

What does this mean for the residents of Remington?

There are things we will need to think about and this is a chance to make a difference in a new development in our neighborhood. The Greater Remington Improvement Association (GRIA) is working to make sure the community has a voice in what will be coming.

To do this, **we need YOUR input.** We need to know what you think about the changes and we ask that you come to one or both of the upcoming meetings and then talk to any of the GRIA board members. Please see public meeting schedule at top right, and spread the word.

Here are some potential questions and issues to think about as you come to the meeting -

HOW DO WE FEEL ABOUT LOWE'S COMING HERE? This is the most important one. We would have the only major home improvement store in the area. On one hand, it'd be nice to have a home improvement store nearby and within walking distance; on the other hand, are the roads prepared to handle that kind of traffic? It would create jobs; but would it also kill small businesses? What do you think?

ARCHITECTURE & DESIGN OF THE AREA: On 24th Street in Remington, a three-story parking garage will face the street. Elsewhere, the buildings are proposed to face in towards a parking lot, rather than out onto the street, which hurts public safety. Should we push for a more pleasant, urban-friendly design? What do you think?

Energy Assistance to help with Winter Chill

Have you heard talk about MEAP but haven't applied yet? Then it's time to get you set up. MEAP is a state program that helps you pay the cost of heating your home and is decided by income and household needs.

MEAP will send money to cover your heating bill directly to your energy supplier each month (if you pay your own heating bill) or to your landlord (if heat is included in your rent).
