Some help for those cold nights

Many residents right here in Remington are eligible for some money off their energy bill. Whether it is gas, oil or electric heat, the MEAP (Maryland Energy Assistance Program). program can help.

Government funds that are set aside to be applied to qualified applicants. If you qualify the program will contact your energy source (BGE) and a payment will be made to your account to help lower the cost on your payment.

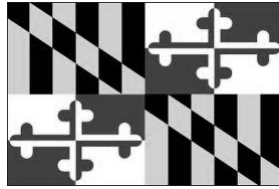

Do you need a MD ID for 2012? Make it happen!



The ID program is a wonderful program designed to assist people obtain their Maryland State IDs. This was started two years ago by Pastor Alice Jellema and now the Episcopal Housing Corporation Community builder has taken over the responsibilities of the job.

Since the program began many Remington residents have been able to get their state IDs, which is an important step in getting one's life on track. An ID is needed when you apply for assistance or cash a check or in many other instances.

This program does everything from giving support and information to providing transportation to the MVA and it even covers half of the cost of the ID. Zenobia is working for you, to get paperwork together and get an ID for you.

But how do you get an ID? Well, first contact Zenobia (her information is below) and then get necessary paperwork ready. Here is a guide of the paperwork needed. It is required that you must have 3 main proofs of identity.

1. Birth Certificate

This is essential, and it can not be a copy or a "birth registration". It must say Birth Certificate at the top. If you need your birth certificate we can help you obtain it.

2. Proof of Social Security

This is either a social security card or an SSA-1099 form, which lists everything you received for the whole year. If you need to go to the social security office to get a benefit letter printed (which they'll do for free on the spot,) it's in the Rotunda shopping center in Hampden.

3. TWO proofs of address

The MVA is very specific about what they will and won't accept. Contact Zenobia for the full list, but a lease, BGE bill or letter from the government all are good. Note that if you use government mail as a proof of address, it has to be in its original envelope.

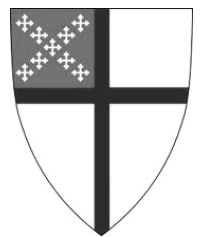
