Hauntingdon V: End of the World is Baltimore's premier family-friendly Halloween block party extravaganza! A community driven event, Hauntingdon provides a fun, free, and safe place for children of all ages to enjoy Halloween.

It takes place Saturday, October 27, 2012, from 5 pm-8 pm, on the 2900 block of Huntingdon Ave. with the whole block closed off for the fun!

Dozens of decorated porches provide fun trick-or-treating spots for kids to engage in activities, centered on this year's theme: *End of the World*, with a special emphasis on the environment.

Join Haunty, the GIANT CRAB, in the children's costume parade! Watch as Fire dancers gleefully prance to live music of local favorites Ricky and Lennon La Ricci! Explore the decrepit Haunted Sewers of Old Remington as their slime covered walls shift before your eyes!

Artwork and decorations made by Remington youth created in the community-run Porch Art weekly workshops is prominently featured, but grown-ups aren't left out of the fun! In the months leading up to Hauntingdon, crafting sessions are held throughout the community to get all the houses on the street prepared.

Keep Winter Out of the House

Free Winterization of your home!

On Nov 3rd, between 10 am and 2 pm neighborhood volunteers are working with Alpha Phi Omega, a local JHU fraternity in preparation for winter. Greater Homewood Association is providing support and Episcopal Housing Corporation is sponsoring the event.

Don't wait to call and sign up to confirm your participation in the Annual Remington Winterization Project that takes place November 3rd. .

The APO fraternity will do winterization work that will include installing plastic on the windows to keep cold air out of the homes, installing door sweeps, insulating the pipes to prevent freezing, and other preparations for the cold months. These steps will help lower heating bills and keep the house warmer when the temperatures drop.



It is FREE, but you must call ahead and make sure you are REGISTERED.

Appointments will be set up for that date and a time convenient for you. Participants

are required to be at the house when the volunteers come to their homes at the appointed times.

There is Still Time to Apply for the Homestead Tax Credit

You must Apply Before DECEMBER 31, 2012

Only 65 percent of eligible City homeowners have not yet applied, don't be one of them. Apply now!

Here is a chance to pay less in property taxes. If you haven't already, please take the time to apply for the Homestead Tax Credit. The purpose of the Homestead Credit Program is to help homeowners afford annual property tax increases on their owner-occupied homes. This Tax credit protects homeowners, regardless of age, income, or property value, from annually spiking tax bills.

Applications must be postmarked or received by or before December 31, 2012, or homeowners will lose this Homestead credit for the tax year beginning on July 1, 2013.

Energy Assistance for 2013

If you pay a BGE bill, whether you own or rent, you may qualify for energy assistance. Maryland Energy Assistance (MEAP) that can help with that bill. Many of your neighbors here in Remington have been helped.



MEAP is a monthly payment made directly to your BGE bill to help lower the cost on your payment.

Please call the EHC office at 410-366-6200 and ask for Betsy to get more information and to set up an appointment. There is certain paperwork required to qualify. You can also stop by the *Church of the Guardian Angel* at 335 W. 27th Street on Wednesdays mornings between 9 am to 10 am to speak to her.

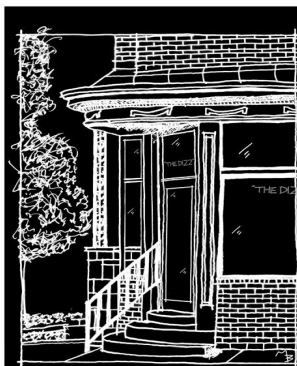
