### GRIA/Remington Wins in City Wide Clean Community Competition

Joined by community leaders from every part of Baltimore, Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake on Saturday morning announced the winners of the first ever Clean Community Competition.

Since the April kickoff of the six-month long competition at the Mayor's Spring Cleanup, seventy-one neighborhood associations developed strategies and took action to keep their communities clean. Remington's own neighborhood group—GRIA (Greater Remington Improvement Association) won for the North West quadrant. Winners

and runners-up were chosen from four quadrants of Baltimore.

GRIA was very aggressive in clean up projects this year. From weekly alleyway clean ups by residents which hauled large items, debris and trash to the Sisson street waste station, adopting the empty lot on Sisson and 27th to create a community garden, coordinating efforts to clear brush and trash from the 30th street playground and park, cleaning and applying clean-themed storm drain stencils, to a Saturday event that handed out over 400 free trash cans for Remington Residents.

Many residents were involved in various projects and GRIA would like to thank them for making this possible. Stop in to the monthly GRIA meeting held at Church of the Guardian Angel on November 19th at 7 pm.



### Seawall Development Takes on Row Houses in Remington

In September, Seawall Development launched its Miller's Square project and it's 30 by 13 initiative. The goal is to redefine and sell 30 houses in Remington by 2013. Seawall's vision is to reinvent the experience buyers have from both the outside and from the inside of the homes.

You may have notice the houses on the 2600 block of Howard Street with the massive windows openings, the cool planter boxes and the exciting colors. The idea is that when you drive past a Miller's Square house you can really see that positive change is happening. The open house on September 23rd, done in partnership with GRIA and Greater Homewood Community Corporation, saw more than 300 people show up and most of the 30 houses sold within a week of the event.
