Butcher Shop, Restaurant and Carrot Theatre to be part of Remington

The owners of Woodberry Kitchen, one the city's most popular dining destinations, are planning to open a butcher shop and restaurant in Remington, according to a February 19th article in the Baltimore Sun.

The new businesses are part of the redevelopment of the old Mr. James Tire Shop at 26th and Howard, which was covered by the *Remington Newsletter* in its January 2013 issue. The restaurant/butcher shop will be accompanied by Single Carrot Theater and office space for Young Audiences, a nonprofit organization.

The project is being developed by Seawall Development Corporation, which also redeveloped Millers Court across the street. Spike Gjerde, the owner of Woodberry Kitchen, said of the project, "We love what's happening in Remington, and we're amped to hopefully be part of a growing community."

Seawall is also working on homes on Remington Avenue across from Anderson's. The large second floor windows are just one of the new visions to create interesting living space. They are part of Sewall's 30 by 13 initiative. The goal is to redefine and sell 30 houses in Remington by 2013. Seawall's vision is to reinvent the experience buyers have from both the outside and from the inside of the homes.

Community School Greenhouse



This years class of The Community School is initiating a long term project to establish a greenhouse to learn horticulture, grow food for the school, and sell plants to keep this project funded.

Several years ago they identified the need to improve the health of the students with nutritious foods. The students are at the school 10 hours a day and there is a hot meal each

day. This is the next step in this process allowing the students to learn about growing food while supplying the school with fresh fruits and vegetables.

This project has been on the drawing board for several years. A deck has been built on the back of the building to locate the greenhouse. Everything has been done with volunteers and donated materials.

A greenhouse has just been ordered - a Riga IIIs that is suited to year round growing. Donations are still needed to complete this, and it's a wonderful project for the Community School and for Remington.

If you are having trouble getting a Maryland State ID, (maybe you need to get a birth certificate first?) don't despair, The Church of the Guardian Angel and Episcopal Housing Corporation can help!

We can walk you through the process, help you fill out paperwork, and provide you with transportation to the MVA. Also, thanks to a donation from Episcopal Housing Corporation, we can cover half the cost of getting an ID AND a birth certificate.


A Friendly Reminder
