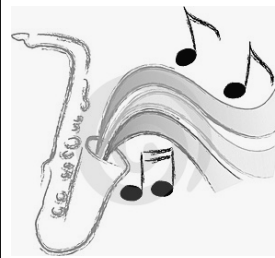
Remington Homework Club
